The Completion Arch

- The Completion Arch is a web based tool that provides quick and easy access to national-, state- and initiative-level data that describe the progress and success of community college students.
- Why focus on community colleges?
 - Largest sector with 10 million + students
 - Broad academic mission (transfer, workforce preparation, developmental education)
 - Serve more students from underserved groups
 - Lower-cost and wider availability = Access and excellence
 - Key to meeting national and state goals for college completion and workforce competitiveness

Economic Development and Employer Planning System

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Units of Analysis:

- 1. Search for and select a topic of interest (i.e. Accounting).
 - a. Notice that a description of the academic programs and occupations are available.
- 2. Click Supply Indicators.
- 3. Filter for Mississippi.
 - a. Notice that there are Accounting educational programs at almost every educational level (at least 1-year certificates through doctoral degrees).
 - b. Also notice that the specific program titles are different depending on where the program is offered.
- 4. Click Schools under the Market Share column.
 - a. You can now see the number of awards granted at each school in Mississippi over the last five years in this discipline by gender.
 - b. At the bottom of the page you can see in which metropolitan/micropolitan area the schools are located.
- 5. Click Demand Indicators.
 - a. Here you can see the projected growth rate, median annual wage, typical level of education for employees in these fields, and the percent that are self-employed.
 - b. Occupational Projections are available which provide the base and projected employment and average annual job openings.
 - c. Wage Trend data (mean and median) are available to compare Mississippi to the nation in this occupation category.

Occupations:

- 1. Here you can view the median wage change, employment growth, and average annual total job openings for each occupation in the SOC.
 - a. Click the Employment Growth 2010-20 column heading Allows you to sort

Programs of Study and Training:

1. Similar to the Occupations features, this page allows you to view the number of graduates of each academic program, change over time, and the most frequent award earned.

Industry Trends:

- 1. Select a State and County / Metropolitan Statistical Area
- 2. Select Mississippi & Harrison county
- 3. Click 31-33 Manufacturing \rightarrow Click 333 Machinery manufacturing
 - a. First, you see the industry trends for the United States
 - b. Next, you see the industry trends for the state of Mississippi
 - c. Last, you see the industry trends for Harrison county
 - d. Each section provides the number of establishments, total employment, total annual wages, and average annual wage across 5 years

Career Clusters:

- 1. Provides broad occupational categories under that can be used to filter down into more specific areas of interest.
- 2. Click Education & Training.
- 3. Click Teaching / Training.
 - a. Notice the variety of teaching occupations.
- 4. Clicking any of these will bring you to the Supply and Demand page which you can examine further.

Staffing Patterns:

- 1. This section allows you to examine the staffing patterns by occupation category or industry.
- 2. Select Industry
- 3. Select 61102 College, universities, and professional schools; State
 - a. Notice that the breakdown provided is the top 10 occupations within this industry code at the national level.
- 4. Select Occupation
- 5. Select 25-1000 Postsecondary Teachers
 - a. Switching to Occupation provides the top 10 industries which employ this occupation

High Skill, High Wage, and High Demand Occupations:

- 1. Click National Information Approach.
- 2. Filter based on appropriate criteria.
 - a. Notice the table changes based on the information you select.

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Information Provided:

- 1. From the home page you can see the Completion Arch (CA) includes data five areas:
 - a. Enrollment
 - b. Developmental Education Placement
 - c. Progress
 - d. Transfer & Completion
 - e. Workforce Preparation & Economic Outcomes
 - f. If you click 'Explore the Arch' more descriptions of the areas, measures, and indicators are provided

Enrollment Data:

- 1. Click Enrollment.
- 2. The Featured Indicator provides longitudinal data trends for this measure.
- 3. Clicking on the dots in the top right of the chart will provide additional breakdowns (i.e. race and percentage of undergraduate students enrolled in the U.S.)
- 4. Click on the Fall Enrollment indicator to the left of the chart.
- 5. Next click on Mississippi.
 - a. Notice the values are shown when you hover over a particular line.
 - b. Also notice that the metrics are explained in detail below the chart (i.e. What it tells us.)
- 6. Click on the arrow at the top right of the chart.
 - a. Notice you can download the data in Excel or PDF format.

Developmental Education Placement:

- 1. Click on Developmental Education Placement
- 2. Click on Participation in Developmental Courses
- 3. Click on Mississippi.
 - a. Notice the charts provide data for Pell Grant recipients, Race/Ethnicity, and Age

Progress:

- 1. Click Progress
- 2. The section is broken up into three subsections:
 - a. Precollege Milestones
 - b. College Milestones
 - c. Momentum
- 3. Click College Milestones
- 4. Click Persistence Over Terms & Years
- 5. Click Mississippi
- 6. Click Completion of Transfer Curriculum
 - a. Notice that some variables are not available for Mississippi

Transfer & Completion:

- 1. Click Transfer & Completion
- 2. Click Graduation Rates
- 3. Click Mississippi
 - a. Notice charts are provided by Gender, Race/Ethnicity, and Time Frame

Workforce Preparation & Employment Outcomes

- 1. Click Workforce Preparation & Employment Outcomes
 - a. Note: that Mississippi does have any data available within this section.

All Indicators:

- 1. Click All Indicators
- 2. Select Mississippi
- 3. Expand menu titles to examine data available

Other Section of Interest:

• Research Briefs
